Senior Vice President, Quality & Regulatory Affairs, Prestige Consumer Healthcare

Executive Vice Dean, Rutgers New Jersey Medical School



Dr. Maria L. Soto-Greene is a tenured Professor and Executive Vice Dean at Rutgers New Jersey Medical School (NJMS). As a clinician educator, she previously held the positions of Director of the Medical Intensive Care Units, Associate Dean for Special Programs, Senior Associate Dean for Education, and Vice Dean. In her current role, she oversees all aspects of undergraduate medical education (admissions, student affairs, education), faculty affairs, professional development, accreditation, and diversity affairs.

Dr. Soto-Greene is a national leader committed to advancing the school's health equity and social justice education and community service. She has been funded by federal and private agencies since the early 1990's serving as the Principal Investigator for the Hispanic Center of Excellence and has passionately worked to create unparalleled opportunities for thousands of individuals underrepresented in medicine and science. These programs support students at the pre-college level through medical school faculty, contributing to career advancement and cultivating the next generation of social justice champions. Equity, diversity, and inclusion is threaded into everything that she does.

As part of the AAMC Medical Education Senior Leaders group, Dr. Soto-Greene is on the Rapid Action Anti-Racism Taskforce. Dr. Soto-Greene received her B.S. degree in Medical Technology from Douglass College, M.D. degree from New Jersey Medical School, completed her internal medicine training at University Hospital in Newark, New Jersey where she also served as Chief Medical Resident, and obtained her Masters in Health Professions Education at the MGH Institute of Health Professions.

DIO/Director of Medical Education, St. Joseph's Regional Medical Center

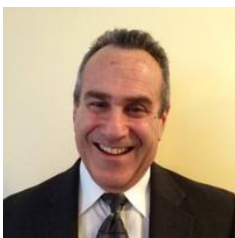
