

Welcome to Camp No-Be-Bo-Sco

Camp No-Be-Bo-Sco, 11 Sand Pond Rd, Hardwick, NJ 07825

This guide will help you get started on your unit's weekend trip, with important information including fees and camp rental policies.

Reservations are not confirmed unless paid in full. You may not clear an outstanding balance at camp.

All cancellations less than 30 days before your rental will receive a 50% refund. All cancellations made less than 14 days before your rental will not receive any refund.

All Camping rentals must have at least two registered adult leaders 21 years of age or over. There must be a registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over in every unit serving females. If a link male and female troop are camping at the same camp, they each need their two-deep registered leader.

All adults staying overnight in connection with a Scouting activity must be currently registered as an adult volunteer or an adult program participant. Adult volunteers must register in the position(s) they are serving in. Registration only as a merit badge counselor position does not meet this requirement. All Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters need to have Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) to be considered Trained to their position. See FAQ for list of approved adult registration fee required positions. (Exceptions for Cub Scout Programs)

# Overnight Tenting:

- Scouts BSA/Crews/Ships/Posts
  - Separate tenting arrangements must be provided for male and female adults as well as for male and female youth.
  - Youth and adults must tent separately, this includes parents/guardians and their children.
  - o Youth sharing tents must be no more than two years apart in age.
- In Cub Scouting, parents and guardians may share a tent with their family.

(Cub Scout Exception – Cub Scout parents or legal guardians taking part in an overnight Cub Scout program with their own child or legal ward are not required to register as leaders. All adults must review the "How to Protect your Children from Child Abuse: A Parent's Guide" that can be found in the front of each Cub Scout Handbook. In addition, the parent or legal guardian must be accompanied by a registered leader at any time they are with youth members other than their own child/ward. All other overnight adults must be currently registered in an adult fee required position.)

Cub Scout unit-coordinated campout must have at least one registered adult leader trained in Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO). Pack camping is a family-centric program. Cub Scout youth should attend the camping event with their parent(s) or guardian(s).

Only Webelos and Arrow of Light dens may conduct den campouts, and those campouts can only include the Webelos or Arrow of Light youth. Webelos and Arrow of Light dens may



participate and camp at a Scouts BSA troop unit campout; however, all Cub Scout camping and YPT requirements still apply, including having a BALOO-trained adult leader in attendance.

All injuries, accidents and incidents are to be reported to the Ranger/Camp master. It is the Unit Leader's responsibility to care for personal injuries.

The possession or use of DRUGS AND ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON CAMP PROPERTY IS PROHIBITED Firearms, archery equipment, air rifles and all fireworks are prohibited.

NO pets are allowed in camp, except certified Service Dogs.

No chainsaws, snowmobiles, dirt bikes, ATV's or sledding.

Check in on Friday is from 7:00 PM – 10:00 PM, Saturday is from 8:00 AM – 11 AM and check out on Sunday is from 8 AM – 11 am. All groups must be off the property by 2 PM.

**Propane Cost:** \$15 per click. (Each click contains 100 cubic feet.)

### **How to Check In:**

Check in on Friday is between 7:00 PM and 10:00 PM. If other arrangements need to be made let us know.

Upon arrival to Camp No-Be-Bo-Sco, please check in at the Camp Office; either a Camp Master or the Camp Ranger will be available for your check-in. You will need to provide a complete roster with names and contact numbers. A deposit of \$50.00 is due upon arrival, this may be cash or a check payable to: Northern New Jersey Council (NNJC). All fees for propane or damages must be reconciled after inspection and before departure.

#### **How to Check out:**

Check out with the ranger before you depart from camp. All groups must depart from camp by 2:00 PM on Sunday.

### Facilities:

Upon making your reservation you choose a specific site, if there is a need for different accommodations and they are available please reach out to the ranger and they can try to make any adjustments. (applicable fees will apply)

Due to Local Health Code Regulations, the Dining Hall is not to be used as a sleeping quarter.

### Parking:

All vehicles will be parked in the main parking lot. One vehicle can take all equipment to the site. For lake sites, we prefer a 4WD vehicle.

### Water:

Seasonal water is located throughout camp during the warmer months. Approximately late-October to mid-April water can be found near the parking lot by the South Shower house and the Winter Well located near Waterfront Cabin

Remember to bring your own water containers.

#### Firewood:

Due to the local infestation of the Emerald Ash Borer in other areas of our state there will be **NO OUTSIDE WOOD** allowed. There is an abundance of wood throughout the camp and a wood pile located near the parking lot.

### Trash:

All trash must be removed from your camping area. There are two dumpsters located behind the dining hall. All trash must be placed with the steal sliding door.

# Fishing:

The pond is a catch and release pond. There is **NO FISHING** on the beach or anywhere within the fenced/roped waterfront area. Fishing is allowed anywhere else around the lake. Please clean up after yourself. We follow all New Jersey Department of Fish and Wildlife rules and regulations related to fishing



# Playfield:

The playfield is available for your enjoyment and activities. These facilities are included with your rental, but we do ask that you coordinate with other units in camp to ensure everyone has availability to use them. Remember to bring your own equipment.

## **Archery and BB Range:**

Ranges are open for use in September, October, April, and May. All reservations must be made at least 3 weeks prior to your rental. Space is limited and not guaranteed without a paid reservation. All reservations can be made through the camp administrator.

# Service projects:

If your unit is interested in helping around camp, please coordinate with the Camp Master or Camp Ranger. There is always an ongoing list of projects listed in the Camp Office.

# **Camp Master Corps:**

The Camp Master Corps is made up of volunteer group that helps complete many of the improvements that are done around camp. The Camp Master also, volunteer one or two weekends a year to help facilitate the check-in/check-out procedures and the help units during their stay.
